
This is the recommended first study book for children aged 6 to 12.

"Learning How To Learn" teaches the young student how to get a very sound grasp on how to study. It teaches a child to never go past a word that he or she does not understand without first finding out the meaning of the word. He then must be able to use the word in sentences until he is confident that he knows what the word means.

It also enables a student to spot and handle barriers to study and the various phenomena that not being able to understand words or concepts bring about. A child will not "give up" or "lose interest" in the study of something once he fully understands what lies behind wanting to give up.

Children should be granted the opportunity to enjoy their studies - "Learning How to Learn" grants them this opportunity and sets them up with the basic study skills and study confidence that they will need for the rest of their lives.









